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Commitment to Christian Values

Honoring God in Thought, Word, and Action

“And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.” Colossians 3:17

I will strive to reflect God’s love and holiness in everything I do because I recognize that my behavior and attitude serve as a testimony of my faith.

Showing Love and Kindness as Jesus Commanded

“My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.” John 15:12

I will treat others with the same compassion, patience, kindness, respect, and grace that Jesus shows to me. By living this way, I honor God and follow His example of love.

Representing Christ in the World

“We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ’s behalf: Be reconciled to God.” 2 Corinthians 5:20

I will live out Christian principles even when it’s difficult, so that others may see Christ through my actions and words. I will have good moral character, and my conduct will reflect such.

Commitment to a Biblical Worldview

Made in His Image

“So God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them.” Genesis 1:27

God has created each person with purpose and care, and I celebrate the truth that we are all made in His image. I believe that God made two distinct genders: male and female - each a unique and intentional part of His creation.

Biblical Intention for Genders

“A woman must not wear men’s clothing, nor a man wear women’s clothing, for the Lord your God detests anyone who does this.” Deuteronomy 22:5

I will practice and promote masculinity (in males) and femininity (in females), in all actions, words, dress, and behavior, as is God’s design for me.

Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

“For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.” Psalm 139:13-14

God does not make mistakes. I will honor the way God created us to be, trusting that He has designed each of us perfectly according to His plan. I affirm that God has created each of us as male or female, with our physical and personal identities reflecting His design and purpose for us.

Biblical Intention for Relationships

“That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh.” Genesis 2:24

Biblical Values of Marriage and Family: Marriage, as described in the Bible, is meant to be a union between one man and one woman. This is God’s design for marriage and family.

I commit to respecting and upholding these beliefs as part of our shared faith community. I understand that relationships outside of God’s design for marriage and family, as described in the Bible, are not aligned with biblical teachings, and I will strive to live according to these values. I understand that public displays of affection are not in keeping with modesty or a biblical worldview, and I will refrain from such actions at school. Together, we support each other in honoring God’s design for each of us with kindness, respect, and understanding.

Respect for Teachers, Staff, and Peers

Respect as Worship

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. Colossians 2:23-24

I will honor my teachers, staff, and classmates as a form of worship, recognizing that my respectful behavior reflects my devotion to God.

Living by God's Commandment to Love Others

"This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'"

Matthew 22: 38-39

I will show respect to my teachers, staff, and fellow students at all times by listening actively, valuing others' viewpoints, and showing kindness, even in disagreements. This love is an essential part of my faith.

Obeying Authority as Obedience to God

"Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." Romans 13:1

I will respect and obey those in authority because this ultimately honors God who has placed these individuals in my life for my growth and guidance. I will listen attentively in class, follow directions promptly, and use respectful language.

Building Others Up with Words

I will use my words to encourage and uplift others. Speaking kindly and avoiding gossip or criticism reflects God's love and builds a supportive community.

Recognizing God's Image in Others

By treating everyone with respect, I honor the inherent dignity that God has given to each of us. I will not participate in teasing or bullying of others. I will not speak unkindly or belittle others.

Promoting a Spirit of Unity within the Body of Christ

"If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything they ask for, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." Matthew 18:15-20

I will promote a spirit of unity within the school by following the biblical model. If a problem arises, I will first contact the school staff member who can help. I will follow the proper chain of command until the problem is resolved. The Bible commands us to make every effort to live at peace and to resolve disputes with each other in private or within the Christian community. I will follow this command by avoiding gossip and slander about frustrations within school, and by speaking directly to those involved, who can help resolve the situation.

I understand that all online activity connected with school must reflect the values and expectations of Blast Christian Academy.

Modesty and Appearance

Honoring God with Our Bodies
